Australian Canoeing Accredited Coach, Instructors, & Guides CODE OF ETHICS

As a coach, instructor, or Registered Guide appointed by *Australian Canoeing*, a *Member Body* or an *Affiliated Club* you must meet the following requirements in regard to your conduct during any activity held or sanctioned by *Australian Canoeing*, a *Member Body* or an *Affiliated Club* and in any role you hold within *Australian Canoeing*, a *Member Body* or an *Affiliated Club*:

1. Treat all students with respect at all times. Be honest and consistent with them. Honour all promises and commitments, both verbal and written.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Respect the fact that your goal as a coach for the student may not always be the same as that of the student. Aim for excellence based upon realistic goals and due consideration for the student's growth and development.
2. Provide feedback to students and other participants in a caring sensitive manner to their needs. Avoid overly negative feedback.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Recognise individual differences in students and always think of the student's long-term best interests.
3. Recognise students' rights to consult with other coaches and advisers. Cooperate fully with other specialists (eg. Sports scientists, doctors, physiotherapists etc).	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Set challenges for each student which are both achievable and motivating.
4. Treat all students fairly within the context of their sporting activities, regardless of gender, race, place of origin, athletic potential, colour, sexual orientation, religion, political beliefs, socio-economic status, and other condition.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• At all times act as a role model that promotes the positive aspects of sport and of canoeing by maintaining the highest standards of personal conduct and projecting a favourable image of the sport of canoeing and of coaching at all times.
5. Encourage and facilitate students' independence and responsibility for their own behaviour, performance, decisions and actions.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Do not exploit any coaching relationship to further personal, political, or business interests at the expense of the best interest of your students.
6. Involve the students in decisions that affect them.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Encourage students and coaches to develop and maintain integrity in their relationship with others.
7. Determine, in consultation with students and others, what information is confidential and respect that confidentiality.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Respect other coaches and always act in a manner characterised by courtesy and good faith.
8. Encourage a climate of mutual support among your students.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• When asked to coach a student, ensure that any previous coach-student relationship has been ended by the student-others in a professional manner.
9. Encourage students to respect one another and to expect respect for their worth as individuals regardless of their level of play.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Accept and respect the role of officials in ensuring that competitions are conducted fairly and according to established rules.
10. At all times use appropriate training methods which in the long term will benefit the students and avoid those which could be harmful.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Know and abide by Australian Canoeing rules, regulations and standards, and encourage students to do likewise. Accept both the letter and the spirit of the rules.
11. Ensure that the tasks/training set are suitable for age, experience, ability and physical and psychological conditions of the students.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Be honest and ensure that qualifications are not misrepresented.
12. Be acutely aware of the power that you as a coach develop with your students in the coaching relationship and avoid any sexual intimacy with students that could develop as a result.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Be open to other people's opinion and willing to continually learn and develop.
13. Avoid situations with your students that could be construed as compromising.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Actively discourage the use of performance enhancing drugs, the use of alcohol and tobacco and illegal substance.
